



Skilled workers in construction and renovation are in high demand:

- Employers include general contractors, subcontractors, new home builders, woodworking shops and restoration contractors.
- There are also opportunities selling building materials in hardware stores, lumberyards and building centres.
- Entrepreneurship and estimating training can help you work towards running your own business as an independent contractor.

HOW YOU'LL LEARN

Gain valuable knowledge and hands-on experience working on a project in the Tyendinaga community:

- Learn as you work on a community project with environmentally sound construction principles.
- Get hands-on instruction in construction techniques, proper tool usage and jobsite safety.
- Learn to work from blueprints, produce basic sketches, develop building details and create computer-assisted drawings.
- Gain skills in carpentry, from base footings to framing, interior and exterior finishing, and fine finishing techniques.
- Develop valuable contacts with local employers.

On-site learning is supported by classroom instruction in construction principles:

- Interpret the Ontario Building Code as it applies to renovations and new construction.
- Navigate local regulations and by-laws; contract documents and tenders; and how to apply for the necessary permits.
- Obtain industry-required certificates in the program, such as Working at Heights and First Aid.

APPROXIMATE COSTS (2016-17)

Tuition is free to those accepted into the program.

Students are responsible for arranging a living allowance.

Any travel expenses associated with on-site renovation projects are the student's responsibility.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

This program is available to Aboriginal people who are unemployed or underemployed.

WHAT'S NEXT?

- Graduates may receive direct entry into Loyalist's Construction Renovation Techniques/Technician diploma program.
- The skills you acquire may also assist in obtaining licences and accreditations such as Red Seal.

- Put your knowledge to the test in state-of-the-art service bays.



FIND YOUR CAREER

A Horticultural Technician works with plants and has knowledge and skills in ornamental horticulture and plant health care. Using tools and machinery, this person installs, grows and maintains indoor and outdoor plants; builds urban and rural landscapes; maintains outdoor properties; cares for turf-grass and golf courses; and installs and maintains irrigation systems.

Technicians are a non-restricted certified trade regulated by the Apprenticeship and Certification Act. On successfully completing the apprenticeship program, a person working in this trade is entitled to a **Certificate of Apprenticeship** and can challenge the trade examination to obtain a Certificate of Qualification. The 441C Horticulture Technician program is a Red Seal trade within Ontario.

A Horticultural Technician is a person who:

- Communicates effectively to achieve results.
- Controls plant pests and diseases using various methods, including integrated pest management.
- Transplants and installs plants.
- Maintains and manages horticultural properties.
- Recycles waste materials.
- Identifies nutrient requirements of plants, applies fertilizers, and monitors the plants and maintains records of results of applications.
- Analyzes plant watering requirements, installs irrigation systems, and monitors and records results.
- Grows plants using different propagation techniques and maintains records of results.
- Prunes plants, considering timing and tools.
- Establishes and maintains turf-grass.
- Constructs landscapes according to drawings, using plants and other materials such as wood, stone, soil, and concrete.
- Maintains and stores tools and equipment.
- Works in compliance with workplace safety legislation.





OSAP

Ontario residents who are Canadian citizens, permanent residents or protected individuals may qualify for Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP), which offers two kinds of money:

- Grants: money you don't have to pay back
- A student loan you need to repay

Both the Ontario government and federal government provide this money. There are various loan and grant programs for:

- Full time students (60%+ of a full course load; 40%+ if you have a permanent disability)
- Part-time students (between 20-59% of a full course load)

To confirm whether OSAP funding applies to a particular program, please visit the program web page online. There is no fee to apply for OSAP. Apply online at osap.gov.on.ca.

Out-of-province students should apply for financial assistance within their home province. Staff in our Financial Aid office will be pleased to assist you. Call them at 613-969-1913 ext. 2425.

SECOND CAREER

The Second Career program offers unemployed or underemployed workers the opportunity to retrain for high-demand occupations in the local labour market. Training can be short term or long term, based on your employment goals. Recently laid-off workers can be active EI claimants, EI reach-back or non-EI eligible. The Second Career program has proven to be very successful in providing an opportunity for displaced workers to pursue training for a new career.

FULL-TIME STUDENTS

To qualify as a full-time student, your course load must represent at least 70% of the hours of two-thirds of the courses required for the semester of the program in which you are enrolled.

ADMISSIONS DECISIONS

Applicants can expect a written decision (accepted, accepted with conditions, waitlisted or not accepted) in the mail. If you wish, you can request a verbal explanation from Loyalist Enrolment Services.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Transfer credits from other post-secondary institutions will be assessed on an individual basis. Applicants with training from other institutions should share this documentation with Loyalist when they apply.

MATURE APPLICANTS

A mature applicant is someone who:

- Is 19 years old on the first day of classes in the year of admission
- Does not have an OSSD or equivalent
- Is a Canadian citizen or permanent resident

EQUIVALENT CANADIAN STANDINGS

In order to be considered for admission to Loyalist, applicants must provide proof of academic standing equivalent to a Grade 12 Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). Applicants from outside Ontario – including international applicants – must submit certified transcripts of their grades. Applicants whose first language is not English must provide documented proficiency in English (see page 96).

DOUBLE DIPLOMAS
