Professor Responsibilities:

- Implements a range of delivery strategies, which complements the varied learning styles represented in a current college classroom and encourages a cooperative learning climate, incorporating evidence-based practice and best practice guidelines
- Develops and implements course learning outcomes and assessment strategies, ensuring program goals are reflected
- Defines, evaluates and validates learning outcomes for courses and programs, ensuring that students are aware of relevant learning outcomes, strategies, and assessment techniques
- Supports student progress in assigned courses through individual tutorial and academic counseling
- Engages in ongoing faculty development opportunities and effectively liaises with colleagues and other College and community partners to maintain a collaborative and relevant learning environment
- Contributes to program development by participating in the Provincial Program Review processes
- Assists in program awareness and program recruitment activities
- Assists with the creation and supervision of student field placements as assigned

Qualifications:

- Advanced Emergency Medical Care Assistant (AEMCA) certified paramedic in good standing with a base hospital
- A Baccalaureate degree in a related health, science or education field preferred. A Master's degree in education would be considered an asset.
- A commitment to excellence in teaching and learning demonstrated through at least five (5) years' experience teaching in a post secondary paramedic program

- Minimum of five to seven (5-7) years of recent Paramedic practical experience is required
